### STUDENT ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND RELEASE

The purpose of this notice is to aid you in making an informed decision as to whether you or your child should participate in interscholastic activities and, as a condition of such participation, sign the foregoing Assumption of Risk and Release. In addition, its purpose is to make you aware that as a student participant and as the parent/guardian of a student participant, it is your responsibility to learn about and/or inquire of coaches, physicians, advisors, or other knowledgeable persons about any concerns that you might have at any time regarding participation safety and the safety of the Olympia School District's interscholastic program.

Participation in interscholastic activities such as football, soccer, basketball, baseball, fastpitch, wrestling, volleyball, track and field, dance/drill, cross country, golf, tennis, cheerleading, gymnastics, swimming/diving, as well as other "non-sport" interscholastic activities is voluntary and extracurricular. As a condition to participation in these activities, the student participant and parent/guardian must agree to assume the risk of injury or death involved in this activity and agree to release the Olympia School District from liability for ordinary negligence in the conduct of these programs.

I also understand that by participating in interscholastic activities, I am subjecting myself to the possibility of injury or death.

We agree to assume all the risk of injury or death associated with the school district's interscholastic program; we further agree to release the Olympia School District, its employees, agents, representatives, coaches, and volunteers from any liability resulting from any ordinary negligence that may arise in connection with the School District's interscholastic activities program. We agree that the terms hereof shall serve as an assumption of risks and a release for all members of our family, for heirs, estate, executor, administrator, assignees, indemnitees, subrogees, or other releasors; and we further agree that if any part of the assumption of risk is held void, the remainder shall continue in full force and effect.

By signing this Assumption of Risk and Release, we acknowledge that we have read its contents and understand its contents and warnings, and that we agree to its terms.

### INSURANCE INFORMATION

The following rules and regulations have been adopted by the District Board of Directors to meet Washington Interscholastic Activities Association (WIAA) rules and regulations as well as standards set forth by the Olympia School District. All rules and regulations apply to interscholastic activities, including cheer, drill and dance activities.

- A. ELIGIBILITY**
1. Previous Semester Rule  
A student shall have been in regular attendance in an elementary, intermediate, or high school during the semester/trimester preceding the season in which the contest is held. A student shall have passed all subjects in the immediately preceding semester/trimester with a minimum of a C grade. Provided further, that exceptions may be granted for those with approved Individualized Education Programs (IEPs).  
2. Scholarship  
In order to maintain athletic eligibility during the current semester/trimester, the student shall maintain a C grade in all subjects. A student who has been in regular attendance and has failed to achieve the foregoing grade requirements in either/or the previous or current semester/quarter shall be placed on probation for a period of three (3) weeks (from the first day of scheduled practice) during this time he/she is ineligible for competition. At the end of the probationary period, if the student is passing all subjects with a C grade, he/she shall be reinstated for full participation. Provided further that exceptions may be granted for those with approved Individual Education Plans (IEPs). The school will inform students on probation of available resources to enhance study skills and/or their abilities in specific subjects.  
Total Semester/Trimester Eligibility and Age
  3. Residence  
A student shall be eligible for two (2) years of participation. A middle school participant shall have reached their 15<sup>th</sup> birthday prior to June 1 of the previous school year.
  4. Transferring Students  
After registering with and/or attending, students changing enrollment to/from one school district to another shall be considered transfer students. In order to be eligible for participation they must meet normal residency requirements and specific requirements stated in WIAA regulations 1810.
  5. Physical Examination  
Prior to the first practice for participation in middle school athletics, a student shall undergo an initial medical examination and be approved for interscholastic athletic competition by a medical authority licensed to perform a physical examination. Physical examinations conducted after June 1, 2004, shall be valid for twenty-four (24) consecutive months or until initial participation at the high school level, which ever occurs first, with an update to be conducted after 13 months. The twenty-four month physical examinations and 13-month updates shall be submitted on forms provided by the District and signed by a medical authority licensed to perform a physical examination that provides clearance for continued athletic participation.

### OLYMPIA SCHOOL DISTRICT MIDDLE SCHOOL ATHLETIC CODE

The following rules and regulations have been adopted by the District Board of Directors to meet Washington Interscholastic Activities Association (WIAA) rules and regulations as well as standards set forth by the Olympia School District. All rules and regulations apply to interscholastic activities, including cheer, drill and dance activities.

#### A. ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS

1. School Attendance  
A student must be in full attendance, all classes, in order to participate. The Athletic Director or Assistant Principal must clear any absences. Provided further, exceptions shall be granted by the Athletic Director for excused tardies.
2. Practice Attendance  
Regular attendance and promptness at practice is a must. If a student is either late or absent they must notify the coach in advance and/or have a valid excuse upon return.

- C. AMATEUR STANDING**
1. An amateur student is one who engages in athletics for the physical, mental, social and educational benefits he/she derives there from and to whom athletics is an avocation and not a source of financial reward. In order to maintain his/her amateur standing, he/she may not:
    - a. Accept merchandise or in-kind gifts of more than \$100.00 in fairmarket value during any one calendar year Sept 1 through August 31. Reduced membership fees or reduced user fees from an athletic club, recreation center, fitness center, golf course, etc. do not count towards the \$100 limit.
    - b. Accept any cash awards.
    - c. Enter competition under a false name.
    - d. Accept payment of expense allowance over the actual and necessary expenses for the trip (entry fees are not considered a reimbursable expense.)
    - e. Sign or have ever signed a contract to play professional athletics.
    - f. Play or have ever played on any professional team in any sport.
    - g. Received or have ever received, directly or indirectly, a salary or any other form of financial assistance (including scholarships, educational grants-in-aid, or any of his/her expenses for reporting to or visiting a professional team) from a professional sports organization.

### D. SPECIAL REGULATIONS

#### 1. General Conduct

Participants are to abide by all rules and regulations stated in the school's "Student Handbook", "Athletic Code", and under Olympia School District policies for Student Conduct. Failure to do so will result in discipline and/or suspension from participation. Discipline that is administered is cumulative for the duration of middle school eligibility unless otherwise noted.

#### 2. Tobacco Use

The use or possession of tobacco products is prohibited and will result in the following:

- a. First Violation: A ten (10) school day suspension from participation. Provided further that a reduction may be granted for participation in tobacco education classes. The full suspension is to be reinstated if the education program is not completed.
- b. Second Violation: Suspension from participation for a period of one (1) calendar year.
